During the congregation's gatherings in March and June, CHMs stated in various ways the need to think of ourselves as part of a larger community, to respect diversity, and to widen the space of our tent by inviting others to Humilty of Mary Center (HMC).

During the discussion, some suggestions included: companioning another person, being intentional about every connection, being open to the unexpected and to form different kinds of community. As members of the Leadership

Conference of Women Religious, we also feel committed to support its goal of nurturing global religious life.

So it was with great joy that we answered "yes" to a special request and welcomed Sisters Huyen Phan and Nuong Bui, members of Lovers of the Holy Cross, to join in community with us, providing them with room and board as well as companionship, prayer and encouragement.

Huyen and Nuong grew up in South Vietnam where they met as young girls while attending public school and living with a group of religious sisters-Lovers of the Holy Cross. Upon graduation from high school they both felt the call to become sisters and said that the love of Jesus is what inspired their choice.

The women are now in their 30s. For the past year they studied English at Northeast Iowa Community College while living with the Presentation Sisters in Dubuque. In anticipation of continuing their education at Scott Community College in Bettendorf, they were searching for a place to live.

CHMs learned of this and saw that the opportunity fit in well with the sense of openness to being a welcoming community. Huyen and Nuong add a spark to our home. Their energy and faith are a blessing.

The joyful pair have separate rooms on the same hallway and spend most of their spare time studying. However, they do find moments to attend Mass, enjoy the gardens and take meals with CHMs. Huyen said that she enjoys the conversations and Nuong is happy to listen to the CHM sisters as they share their experiences in religious life. She finds life at HMC to be very peaceful. Huyen added that she loves the closeness of a small community.

They don't complain except for the hardship of learning a new language. But they seem to be doing quite well as it isn't hard to understand that they love the view, the meals and the people.

The women plan to return to Vietnam after finishing their schooling at St. Ambrose University. Nuong is focused on healthcare while Huyen will major in sociology and accounting. With their new skills they will help their sisters in the LHC community.

Meanwhile, we Sisters of Humility are open to being surprised by things we learn about another culture and about ourselves in the process.

The Congregation of the Humility of Mary has signed on to help develop the Quad City Sanctuary Coalition with Unitarian Universalist Congregation of the Quad Cities (UUCQC). The UUCQC is willing to host an undocumented individual or small family that is at risk for immediate deportation while their immigration status is being resolved. The purposes of the coalition are to:

- broaden awareness of the availability of sanctuary
- provide support for the sanctuary efforts of the congregation with donations of time, talent, and/or treasure
- foster connection to the immigrant community that will help identify potential guests in need of sanctuary
- support other local congregations who wish to establish sanctuary
- advocate for immigration reform

Becoming a broad-based community coalition will make our organizations a powerful voice for immigration justice.





Shortly after purchasing the land known as Our Lady of the Prairie Retreat, the Sisters of Humility expanded their ministry of hospitality and prayer by creating a new building— Prairie Heights—beyond the restored Victorian farm house. Prairie Heights came to fruition through a capital campaign, and guests were welcomed to the sacred space in October 2003. The building was dedicated and blessed on October 4, 2003, the feast of St. Francis.

The music reminded us that where love dwells, we can all live safely, learn to forgive, and build our hopes, dreams and visions together.

"I can't believe the spirit of this place," exclaimed Tom Fennelly, a Russell Construction manager, when he first walked inside the front door of the original Victorian House. This spirit remains today, as God's peace and love flows forth to those who visit. Recently, a young woman drove in to admire the property. When I stopped to talk with her she said, "There is a real spirit here. I can feel it." Then she began to tear up and drove away. God touched her heart that day.

Fifteen years and hundreds of guests later, we celebrated the 15th anniversary of Prairie Heights. On October 4th members of the Sisters of Humility, associates, advisory committee members and OLPR staff gathered for a blessing and Mass of Thanksgiving led by Bishop Thomas Zinkula.

Readings, petitions, songs and prayers from the prayer service of 2003 were incorporated into the liturgy. It was, indeed, a celebration as the prayerful words spoken by the bishop captured what was felt in our hearts and created a bond of unity. The music reminded us that where love dwells, we can all live safely, learn to forgive, and build our hopes, dreams and visions together.

Our celebration ended with a hearty meal, stories and laughter. We felt energized as we returned to work, filled with enthusiasm and energy that carried us through our day and I'm sure into the New Year.
