

# A Life-Giving Relationship

Editor's note: When sisters took their vows and joined the CHM community, their biological family relationships changed, like anyone who leaves home, but they certainly didn't give up their life-giving relationships.

As a sister grows nearer to Christ her love for her biological family often deepens. The visits they have together and the correspondence they send become precious opportunities to share with one another on a deeper spiritual level.

Old fashioned writing and mailing of letters has always been a part of staying in contact with family and still is. Times have changed and like all of us, sisters are quite often found corresponding with family on the internet. One sister said in regard to her developing relationships with her young nieces and nephews, "Social media rocks for family connections!"

If you have a special story about your family connection with a Sister of Humility, please send it our way. Here is one from Nick Vasquez about a special bond with his great aunt, Sister Delphine Vasquez:

There were only a few encounters as a child with my Great Aunt Fina, which I regret. My mother, along with most, call her Sister Delphine. But our relationship is personal and I have always felt she was not one for formalities, so Aunt Fina is what I prefer!

Around 2009 it had been a decade or more since I had seen her last. Ironically, the previous two years, I had been living a block away from Humility of Mary Center where CHM sisters live. Of her 12 siblings my Great Uncle Ron was one that I grew up seeing regularly. He had always told me, "Go over to the convent and see your Aunt Fina."

One arbitrary day, as I was driving down Central Park Avenue, I stopped in and left a note for her to call, feeling I was living too close not to try to at least say hello or catch up.

Since that day, ten years ago, we have been sharing a meal, stories and small talk a few times each month. At first, most of our conversations were about our family—my grandpa, who had passed before I was born, and my grandma, who was not a favorite among most of the siblings. I was very curious as to why we were all so distant. My curiosity didn't last long

after reflecting on the large number of relatives in the family and the many countries in which they live.

After joining the CHMs, Aunt Fina was traveling the world for the better part of her young adult life, working as a teacher for the Peace Corps and the Department of Defense among other ministries. When this became the topic of our conversations, my admiration grew quickly for her devotion to a life of service.

Growing up in a very devout Catholic family, I had a decent understanding of Aunt Fina's religious vocation, but I was only familiar with sisters who taught in my school. It is awe-inspiring to hear the stories of her work. She has such a wealth of cultural, spiritual and emotional knowledge—as opposed to a primarily indoctrinated outlook and function in the church.

As time passed, our relationship grew more towards a family dynamic, as well as she became my mentor in spirituality. It is a true, honest joy spending time together.

Now our trips to restaurants, Walgreens and eagle watching have become very casual in conversation. Although there are usually philosophical overtones, primarily because I feel I have so much to learn from her, we also like to talk about the ins and outs of cheeseburgers, movies and hummingbirds.

I am very grateful for our relationship at this point in my life. She exudes such positive energy and our meetings always give me a fresh perspective, even if the conversation is mostly about butterflies.

## **20 Years of Spiritual Retreats**

This year marks the 20th Anniversary of CHMs providing spiritual retreats at Our Lady of the Prairie Retreat. The Prairie is a place of beauty and solitude that people from all walks of life can enjoy.

Fr. Vincent Fabula purchased the 200-acre farm from the Dierickx family in 1992 with a vision that it could provide a space for people to visit and experience renewal.

Following his death, the sisters purchased the sacred ground in 1999. The sisters saw the need for more overnight accommodations and a large gathering space for groups, so in 2003 Prairie Heights was built. The facility can comfortably house up to 11 overnight guests and the large gathering space can accommodate 40 guests.

The Prairie grounds are home to many reflective spaces for those who seek quiet time:

- A Labyrinth, constructed in 2000-2001 with the help of the Quad City Labyrinth Project and local Boy Scouts, provides a place for contemplation.
- The outdoor Stations of the Cross, once beautifying the grounds of Marycrest College, were transported and erected in 2000 by the Knights of Columbus.
- A memorial garden of stones to honor sisters and friends of the prairie is located in the center of the Stations of the Cross.
- The Cosmic Walk, created in 2013 by Eagle Scout Mathew Townsley, offers a 2.5-mile walking path with 22 stone markers that highlight the eras of universal creation. Along the pathways, 7 benches offer rest to those who walk the grounds.

Our Lady of the Prairie Retreat is

committed to serving meals using naturally-raised healthy foods. Our garden grows many of the vegetables used in our meals, and our greenhouse was built in 2014 to provide fresh greens throughout the year.

We planted pollinator strips along the Prairie driveway in 2014 to attract bees, butterflies, and birds. Since that time a greater variety of butterflies and birds have been seen throughout the Prairie.

Solar panels were installed on the grounds in 2016 as a source of alternate energy. We strive to find other ways to lead the way in the fight against climate change, including the possible addition of charging stations for electric cars.

We invite you to experience the beauty of The Prairie during our Annual Spirit of the Prairie on Sunday, August 18, 2019, from 3:00-6:00 pm. During this event a riding tour around the Prairie will be available to introduce you to these attractions.


